

**ECEMS Meeting Minutes**  
**June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2005**  
**Redmond Fire and Rescue Training Room**

Meeting called to order by Chair Mooers at 1005hrs

**Present**—Mike Mooers, LaPine; Bruce Turney, Black Butte; Tom Wright, Bend; Jon Cloutier, Zoll; Chad Marsh, Bound Tree; Michelle Moore, Air Life; Scott Spaulding, Crooked River Ranch; Dave Pickhardt, Redmond; Ken Enoch, Sisters; Mike Lepin, Jefferson County; Mary Raymond, COCC; Dusty Miller, Warm Springs.

**Approval of Previous Minutes:** Mike made a motion to approve the May meeting minutes, Tom 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed.

**Communication Report**—Tom presented a thank you letter from Vern Bartley for the gifts for his retirement.

**Treasures Report**—Tom reported \$4,640.75 in account. Tom reported some problems with the bank statements. Safe kids and CISD haven't been receiving statements. Tom filed a three month extension for the audit. Tom recommended to the group a couple of options. Consolidate the three accounts (Safe Kids/CISD/ECEMS) to one account, and/or change banks. Ken advised Tom on the options of online banking. Mike made a motion to consolidate the accounts into one, Dave 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed without opposition. Mike asked the group to check with their own departments on an SOP for tracking money going in and out.

**Committee Reports**

**Education**—Mary informed that graduation is near, all students passed term practicals. Internships doing well. 32 of the 33 students are placed, 5 have completed the internships so far. Renumbering of the courses is going on. All Structural Fire classes will begin with SFS. All EMS classes moving to 100 & 200 level. Intro into EMS will now be a 4 credit class, ½ fire ½ EMS topics. A new instructor for EVOC will be from Crook County Fire, they will also host the lab portion of the class. Mary is still looking for an EMT-Basic instructor for winter term. Grants have been obtained from the Perkins Foundation. \$11,200 of lab equipment like a new Sim man, IV arms, Zoll AED trainer, 12-lead rhythm generator was purchased. Looking at requiring unaffiliated students to do a ride-along every term. Discussion on options for optimal internship time. The group would like the students to be more practically prepared for the internships. 24 students for next year. The group to endorse that students complete all clinical requirements prior to placing them in Central Oregon internship sites. Discussion on FTO prerequisite skills, education, and requirements.

**Protocols**—Dave stated the meeting at SCMC-Bend went well. The group reviewed four protocols. Acute Coronary Syndrome to replace chest pain. Pain

Management, Psychiatric/Anxiety, and a more liberal Amiodarone protocol. More protocol meetings to come, then eventually a complete rollout of all the changes.

**MCI**—The drill will most likely merge into the airports tri-annual drill. Seems like everything is at a standstill. Meeting scheduled for June 9<sup>th</sup>. Tom reported back that medical task forces are still in effect, Deschutes Co. 911 should know what to do if requested.

### **Old Business**—

- A) Autolanch issue has been handled. Tom informed the group that Airline and OPS chiefs had a good meeting yesterday. A no fly zone has been established around the city of Bend. Airline was given ASA maps.
- B) Chad reported that the conference is coming. Chad asked for input on possibilities for the location. The place would need to hold ideally 150 students. Ideas such as the Deschutes Co. Fairgrounds, SCMC-Bend, McMinimums, Eagle Crest. Chad would also like members to brainstorm ideas for possible topics and instructors. Tom would like the National DOT recertification series, Dave suggested a wellness track. Chad estimated the maximum individual cost would be approximately \$130
- C) Jon reported the Bluetooth project is still underway. He is currently working on a pricing estimate for agencies PDA's, and Bluetooth cell phones. Each individual chip for the M Series is \$1595.00 -20% from the Fire GPO. Jon recommends the HP IPAC PDA for this application.
