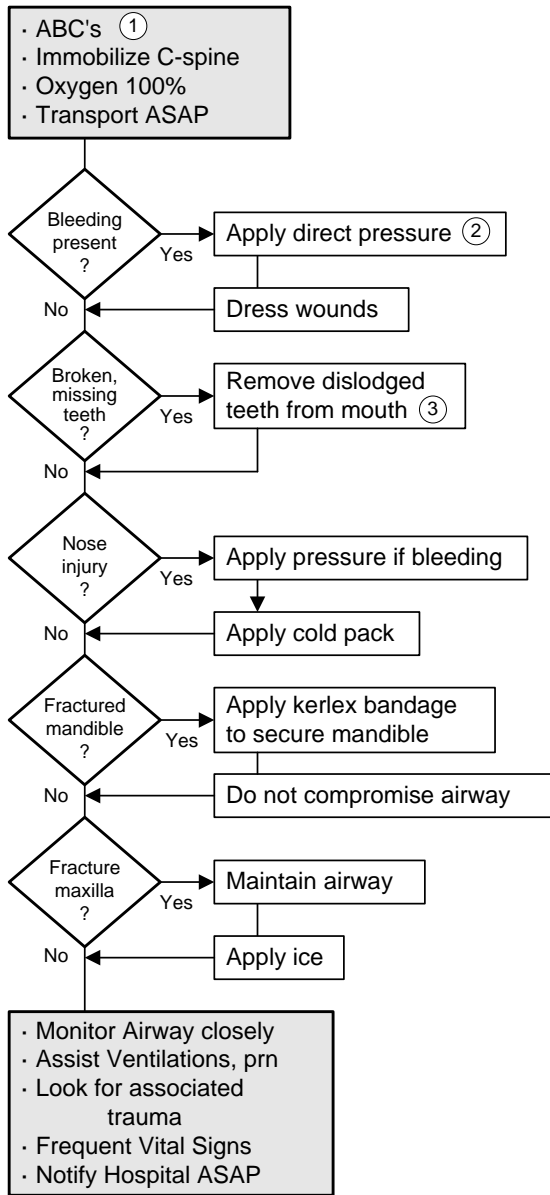

ALS BLS Protocol

1 If you are BLS and the patient has airway problems, respiratory distress or is hemodynamically unstable, request ALS Backup ASAP.
 2 Use pressure point if needed.
 3 If you find an intact missing tooth pick it up by its crown (protect root) and place in milk while enroute to the hospital. If you are more than 20 minute out of the receiving hospital, Contact Medical Control.
